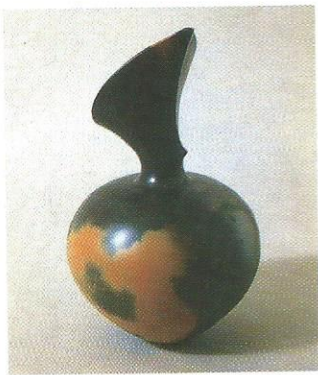

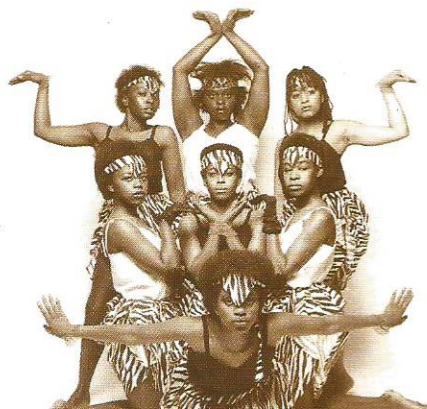


# A ONCE IN A DECADE EXHIBITION

Six talented women from all parts of the world are being featured in a joint exhibition to be held at African Heritage during the month of July to coincide with UN Decade of Women's Conference.



The largest extravaganza ever staged by African Heritage in Nairobi was for the United Nations Decade of Women in 1985. Events included concerts, festivals, lectures, slide shows, exhibitions.
